Two-Part Frozen Scene About Blood

Hebrews 9:12 tells us that Jesus did not enter the Holy Place by means of the blood of goats and calves; but he entered the Most Holy Place once for all by his own blood. This gave us our eternal salvation.

Frozen Scene Part I

- In the old covenant, people's sins were wiped away with the blood of sheep and other animals.
- Make a frozen scene in which priests are knifing animals on an altar.

Frozen Scene Part II

- In the new covenant, people's sins are wiped away with the blood of Jesus.
- Make a frozen scene showing the crucifixion of Jesus.

Show these scenes side by side to the whole group for 30 seconds. Then have them guess what you are showing.

When they have guessed, read aloud to the group the bolded/italicized sentence above.

Two-Part Frozen Scene About the Law

II Corinthians 3:7 tells us that the law of the old covenant was engraved in stone. Hebrews 8 tells us that the law of the new covenant is written in our minds and hearts.

Frozen Scene Part I

- The new covenant laws were written on stone.
- Make a frozen scene in which someone is writing on stone with a finger.

Frozen Scene Part II

- The new covenant laws are written in our minds and hearts.
- Make a frozen scene in which someone is writing on a heart and a mind with a finger.

Show these scenes side by side to the whole group for 30 seconds. Then have them guess what you are showing.

When they have guessed, read aloud to the group the bolded/italicized sentences above.

Two-Part Frozen Scene About Priesthood

In the Old Testament, the Levites were the priests who came directly to God. But Jesus changed this. I Peter 2:9 says that you, as Christians, are a royal priesthood and that, as priests, you should declare the praises of God.

Frozen Scene Part I

- In the Old Testament a few came directly to God in behalf of the many.
- Make a frozen scene in which one person raises hands in prayer to God while the others sit quietly.

Frozen Scene Part II

- In the New Testament all Christians, as priests, go directly to God.
- Make a frozen scene in which all people raise hands to God in prayer.

Show these scenes side by side to the whole group for 30 seconds. Then have them guess what you are showing.

When they have guessed, read aloud to the group the bolded/italicized sentence above.

Two-Part Frozen Scene About Responding to Evil

“You have heard that it was said, ‘Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth,’” Jesus said in his Sermon on the Mount. But then Jesus offered a new lens—a new way. Now, he said, if someone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also.

Frozen Scene Part I

- The Old Testament way was to return evil for evil.
- Make a frozen scene in which two people are fighting each other.

Frozen Scene Part II

- The New Testament way is to return good for evil.
- Make a frozen scene in which one person does evil to a person who then returns good.

Show these scenes side by side to the whole group for 30 seconds. Then have them guess what you are showing.

When they have guessed, read aloud to the group the bolded/italicized sentence above.

Two-Part Frozen Scene About Glory

Paul says in II Corinthians 3:9 that the old covenant was glorious, but he also says that the new covenant is even more glorious.

Frozen Scene Part I

- The old covenant had some glory. It relieved people of sin. It gave people ways to know God and worship God.
- Make a frozen scene that shows some glory on people's faces and gestures.

Frozen Scene Part II

- The new covenant had greater glory. It invites all people into a direct relationship with God. It brings the Holy Spirit and a way to have lasting righteousness.
- Make a frozen scene that shows much glory on people's faces and in their gestures.

Show these scenes side by side to the whole group for 30 seconds. Then have them guess what you are showing.

When they have guessed, read aloud to the group the bolded/italicized sentence above.
